

COED Divisions

Teams are expected to review the division information and description and register themselves in the most appropriate division. Calgary COED Rec Soccer reserves the right to move any team up or down a division based on past results as well as registration numbers.

Teams will be divided into pools within each Division. Past season results will be used to help determine which teams are grouped together. Pools within a division are not considered higher or lower than the other but are considered equal groups.

Competitive

- Competitive level of play, style of play, and skilled players
- Prior experience playing in Provincial Division teams
- Teams that have players from Premier Division or played AMSL/UWS in the past 24 months register here
- More advanced level of game play and tactics

Intermediate

- Most players have organized soccer experience
- Some players may be new to the game of soccer
- Most are proficient with the fundamentals

Recreational

- Players will have some organized soccer experience, many may be beginners, or those who have never played organized soccer.
- Game fundamentals such as passing, shooting and general rule knowledge may be limited.
- Participation is focused on social more than intense competition

Ultra Recreational

- Most players have limited to no organized soccer experience
- Social atmosphere on the field between both teams is primary focus of players.
- The style of play for all players involved is a recreational, social style of play. Players who compete with intensity, regardless of skill level, should not be registered here.

Definitions

- **AMSL/USL-2/UWS** – The Alberta Major Soccer League, United Soccer League, United Women’s Soccer. PDL has been renamed in 2019 to the USL-2 league.
- **Provincial Division** – Provincial divisions refer to the division in Men’s and Women’s leagues that compete for the opportunity to participate in Alberta Soccer’s Provincials.
- **Organized Soccer** – This term is used broadly to describe players that have had some level of technical training in soccer. A player who has played organized soccer has the basic knowledge of the game as well as basic technical skills (although they may be a little rusty..)
- **Beginners** – Describes someone who is learning the game or is returning after a significant hiatus. Game fundamentals such as passing, shooting and general rule knowledge may be limited.
